


FATAL CROSSING - Past and present collide in the story of NWA Flight 2501 over Lake Michigan

Presented by Valerie Van Heest

The crash of Northwest Flight 2501 into Lake Michigan off the coast of South Haven on June 24, 1950, marked the worst American aviation accident at the time when all 58 people aboard lost their lives. Authorities could not find the wreckage, the cause of the crash could not be determined, and the accident was soon forgotten. More than half a century later, Valerie Van Heest became interested in the accident when research conducted in 2003 by the Michigan Shipwreck Research Association (MSRA), cofounded by Van Heest, determined that the aircraft had gone down in the same general vicinity as a number of lost ships the group hoped to find. Van Heest, who adopted this as a passion project, amassed a collection of primary information never before considered in the aftermath of the accident, and years later had her narrative nonfiction novel, *Fatal Crossing*, about the aircraft's disappearance and the group's effort to find the wreckage, published. 


